Return of Free Breakfast in Schools Welcomed by Students

Gov. Tom Wolf announced last month that he was bringing back the universal free school breakfasts starting this month through the end of the school year. He is using \$21.5 million left over in the state's school food service account to cover the cost of the meal not reimbursed by the federal government for all 1.7 million Pennsylvania students.

West Shore School District Superintendent Todd Stolz said the district's 13 school buildings reported a 117% increase in breakfast participation on Tuesday from the 593 morning meals served on Sept. 6 when the district began charging \$1.85 for breakfasts.
