Pennsylvania Policy Update

BUDGET WEEK PASSES BILLS REGARDING SCHOOL MEALS

House Bill 2180: School Meal Debt Fund

Passed the House on July 1, 2024 (145-57)

This bill amends the Public School Code of 1949 to provide a School Meal Debt Fund aiming to eliminate meal debt in schools.

A proposed plan seeks to **wipe out nearly \$80 million in school meal debt** across Pennsylvania. Additionally, it aims to introduce a **free meal program** in public schools.

A SNIP OF SNAPA'S RESPONSE:

"School lunch debt is a problem, no doubt. But the current legislative proposal (H.B. 2180) to spend \$80 million of state dollars to eliminate past lunch debt does not help address the problem of feeding our kids today." House Bill 2420: Keystone Fresh Program

Engrossed on July 1 2024 - 50% progression

This program aims to **enhance** access to fresh and nutritious food. It includes the Fresh Schools Grant Program, Keystone Producer Grant Program, and Keystone Assistance Grant Program. Additionally, the bill establishes the Keystone Fresh Fund.

The administration of the Keystone Fresh Program falls under the Department of Education and the Department of Agriculture.

Federal Policy Update

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) released federal guidelines for income eligibility for free and reduced-price school meals and free milk for the 2024-25 school year. These guidelines will **help more families access resources for school meals.**

Senators Bob Casey and John Fetterman introduced two bills to **expand access to free or reducedprice school meals:**
